# 406. MEMBERS INTERESTS

# 407. POLICING AND COMMUNITY WARDEN REPORT

PC Andy Howe provided a report as follows:

- A good level of reduction of most crime types except for a robbery offence and sexual offences, attributable to a spate of accostings.
- Quite a large number of calls to Minster in the last month although these were mostly calls of concern rather than crimes.
- Report of a red off-road motorcycle being ridden on the recreation ground and causing damage to the football pitch. Information on where this bike is from/who it belongs to would be welcomed.
- Speed-checks have been conducted in the villages along with poaching patrols.
- TDC has recruited nine new police officers within the Community Safety Team who will be a welcome addition.

# 408. COUNTY COUNCILLOR & DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORTS

Cllr Smith reported as follows:

- The officer for the Guildcrest application in Monkton Street in not mindful to approve the application due to SUDS, highway and ecology issues and loss of agricultural land.
- Another meeting was held in relation to devolution but there has been no further clarity.
- National Grid have submitted their application for development consent for SeaLink.
- Citizens Advice surgery is being held at Minster Library on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2025.

• Planning application at 55 High Street has been called in and Cllr Ingleton has requested that a site visit is carried out.

Cllr Crow-Brown reported as follows;

- Little to report with elections coming up.
- Carried out a review of traffic issues around the parish with Cllr Ingleton.
- Met with Tony Freudman who has met with the Home Office and discussed the possibility of a roundabout at Spitfire Way.

- Attended TDC Standards committee with no major misdemeanours and largely councillors reporting other councillors.

# 413. PLANNING, HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE

RESOLVED: That the minutes of the Planning, Highways & Transportation meeting held on 24<sup>th</sup> March, be received and the recommendations within them be approved. Cllr Ingleton reported as follows:-

Pressing KCC for a Trieff kerb to protect the Staces property.

BDW are not adhering to the Construction Management Plan as the wheelwash has not been installed. TDC enforcement acknowledged this and BDW have submitted a conditions application to vary the CMP. MPC are objecting to this.

Further variances to conditions 220 and 221 for foul drainage. MPC had made No comment but on review there is no access to crates to be maintained. MPC objects to this on the basis that no means of access is available to check the potential siltation and blocking-up of the crates over time.

Hedge has been partially removed at the top of Tothill Street as part of the S278 works form the BDW site. The Clerk got these works stopped and is following it up with KCC. Objecting to 55 High Street application.

Spitfire Junction improvements - need to understand where the money from BDW Section 106 will be spent it could be used for a footway provision.

## 414. <u>COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVE REPORTS</u>

Members received reports from representatives of the following bodies:
